

- It involves an inquiry process characterized by a detailed, comprehensive, systematic and in-depth examination of the object of study case. our main research problem is to understand how relevant initiatives for the inclusion of migrant women are generated.
- In the Multiple Case study, each Unit of Analysis is relevant to the entire investigation (Stake, 1995).
- In Voices of Immigrant Women, each country will form a case that will be exploratory in the first instance and analytical when correlated with the rest of the countries so that the causes, consequences and correlates can be deepened (Coller, 2000, p.44).









COMPLEXITY, INTERDISCIPLINARITY AND HOLITIC APPROACH OF THE PHENOMENON

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Each Case (country of study) will be shape of:

- various **sub-elements of analysis** (individuals or groups, geographic units and products generated -policies, publications, statistics-)
- different **levels of concretion** that are interrelated (micro-perspective, meso-perspective, exo-perspective and macro-perspective).
- **Combined relationship** of the four levels of concretion.










Figure nº 1: Analysis sub-elements and levels in each Case Study.

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

Migrations, Gender and Inclusion in the European Context: An Interdisciplinary Approach

The Virtual Learning Course is aimed at university students from different disciplines, research staff, Higher Education teachers and professionals working in the field to address the social inclusion of migrant women with a gender perspective from Human Rights, an intersectional and interdisciplinary approach.

Learning modality: online.

Objective of the course: to improve the training of the different **social agents that work or will work in the near future in the field of migration** and thus contribute to combating discrimination, segregation, racism, harassment and violence, assuming the triple role that the university must play, both in research, training and social commitment.

The contents are organized in 8 modules and each module has a double dimension: one transnational and one national. The training is based on theory and practice.

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


