






Advantages:

1) It helped students to become familiar with complex subjects and understand how many different factors may affect multifarious phenomena








Advantages:

2) It allowed students to test many different assumptions and working hypotheses through the use of various scenarios, in order to overcome the inherent problems of the fragmented material evidence of prehistory.








Advantages:

3) The possibility to work with current, well-known issues (e.g. domestic violence, pandemics, etc.), helped to understand that fuzziness and complexity are not limited to poorly-known prehistoric phenomena, but extends also to modern phenomena


- 4) Since online courses were unavoidable, it proved an excellent tool to engage student in the teaching/learning process, causing excellent discussions and debates, to an otherwise rather passive audience of students.
- 5) Suitable tool for interdisciplinary international collaboration, when the background of the participants is diverse, as seen in the Valencia Workshop (February 2022)






Problems:
